


History and Context

- Arts Working Group (now ACCGR) began meeting in 2019 with the support of Steelcase, prompted by three needs:
 - A cultural plan for the City
 - DEI initiatives across the sector
 - Sustainable funding for the arts
- Much focused shifted toward sustainability through COVID-19
- Renewed focus on original goals led to Commission presentation in December 2023 on the needs of the sector.





History and Context

- Pursuant to Commission discussion and direction from December's presentation, the City contracted with GVSU to conduct an economic impact study of the arts sector, with a focus on non-profit arts organizations.
- This work took place through the spring and summer of 2024, culminating with this report.










Visitors to Arts and Cultural Events






Economic Impact of the GRACS – Economic Activity





Ongoing work and next steps

- The City has collaborated with ACCGR to submit an NEA Our Town grant that would support the development of an arts and culture strategic plan for Grand Rapids and Kent County (response expected in March 2025).
 - Grant performance period would begin July 1, 2025 for two years.
 - We continue to explore ways we might accelerate that work if desired by the City and County.
- In September, the DeVos Institute of Arts Management announced a capacity-building program for up to 15 local non-profit arts organizations, along with a separate "environmental scan" of the sector to be conducted over the coming months.
