What Is CIT?

- CIT is a community informed public safety training program.
- This program enhances the important training that the City's public safety departments already receive by partnering with community to design culturally relevant training.
- This is a collaborative initiative that brings City staff, neighborhoods, nonprofit organizations, and community members together to help design public safety trainings.



How Does CIT Work?





This first stage of creating community informed trainings involves listening to the opinions, thoughts, and desires of community members.

Some community members have ideas; others have fully developed training modules. CIT is designed to accommodate both options.



The development stage involves evaluation and tailoring of pre-designed trainings or the creation of new training modules based on ideas presented from community.



Each training looks and feels different. Some trainings are presented by community members and others are presented by trained professionals.

Over **220** individuals have participated in CIT's trainings/programs.
