These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the City of Grand Rapids and the Grand Rapids Housing Commission (GRHC).

**REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS**

On or about June 8, 2026, the City of Grand Rapids will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of federal HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) funds under Title II of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, as amended. Also, on or about this date, the City of Grand Rapids, in coordination with the GRHC, will submit a request to HUD for the release of Project-Based Vouchers in compliance with the requirements stated in the Housing Act of 1937, as amended, and Section 519 of the Quality Housing and Work Responsibility Act of 1998. These resources will support the following undertaking within the City of Grand Rapids, County of Kent:

**Alpine Senior Apartments  
1625 Alpine Avenue NW, Grand Rapids, MI 49504**

The project involves the demolition of an existing commercial building and the construction of a 4-story apartment building. The multifamily residential building will contain 52 1-bedroom and 2-bedroom apartments. The units will be available to seniors age 55 years of age and older with incomes between 30% to 70% of the Area Median Income (AMI). Other amenities include a fitness center and a community room with a kitchenette. Each apartment will be furnished with a dishwasher, a washer, and a dryer. A total of 39 parking spaces will be provided, along with exterior and interior bike racks. The estimated total development cost is \$17,746,602. Up to \$500,000 in FFY 2025 City HOME program income is reserved for the project, and the development is anticipated to receive ten (10) Project-Based Vouchers from the GRHC.

**FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT**

The City of Grand Rapids has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. ## ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The City of Grand Rapids certifies to HUD that Mark Washington, in his capacity as City Manager, consents to accept the jurisdiction of the federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certifications satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the City of Grand Rapids and the GRHC to use their respective Program funds.

## OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of funds and the City of Grand Rapids' certifications for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the requests (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certifications were not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Grand Rapids; (b) the City of Grand Rapids has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs, or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Detroit Field Office, 477 Michigan Avenue, Detroit, MI 48226, directed to: 1) Keith E.
